Our RFD Members go above and beyond in caring for our customers, while displaying respect and integrity.

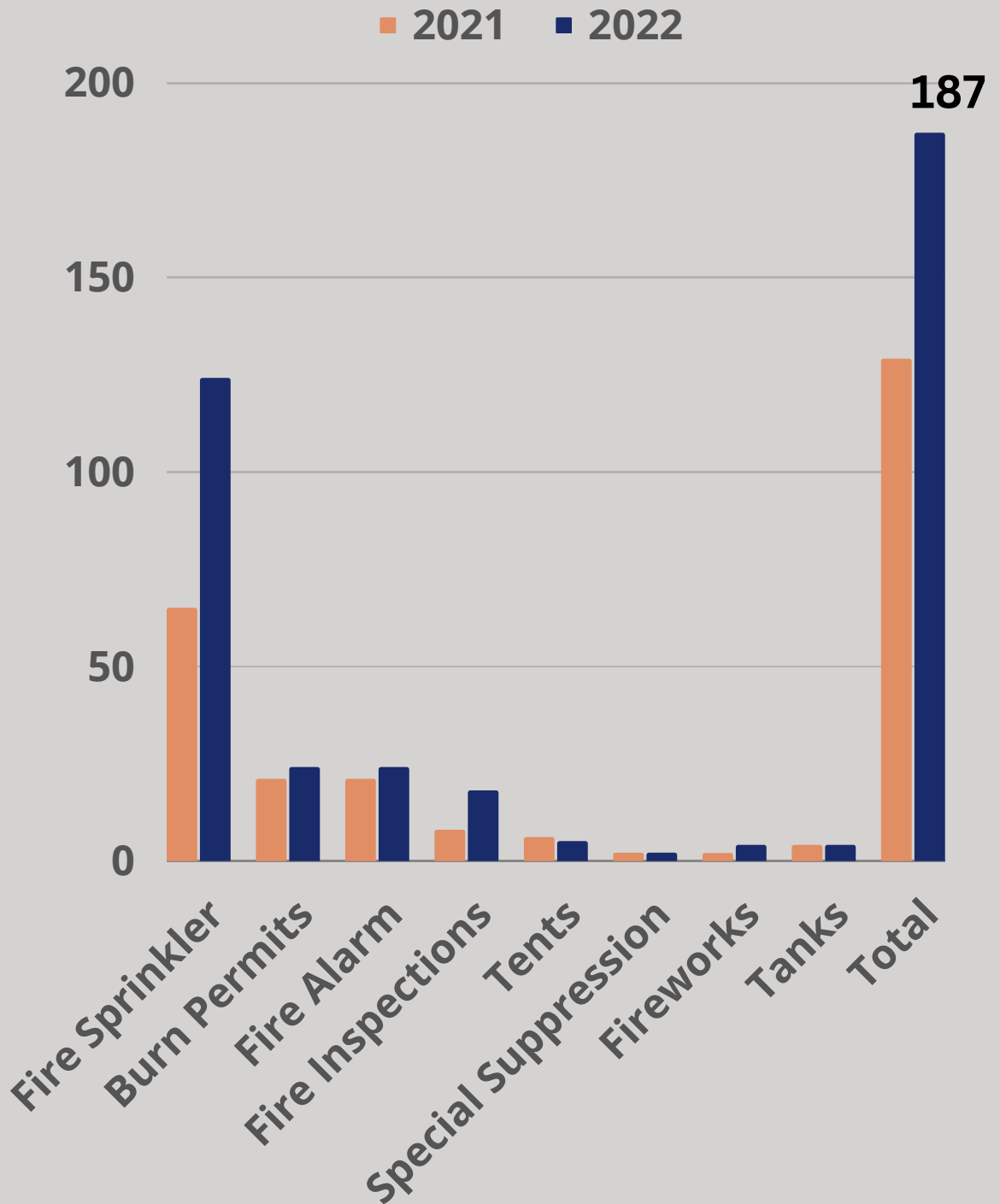

New firefighters are required to become certified in Firefighter I and II, Hazardous Material Operations, Fire Apparatus Operator, and Emergency Medical Responder training within two years of joining the Rogers Fire Department.

Topics include:

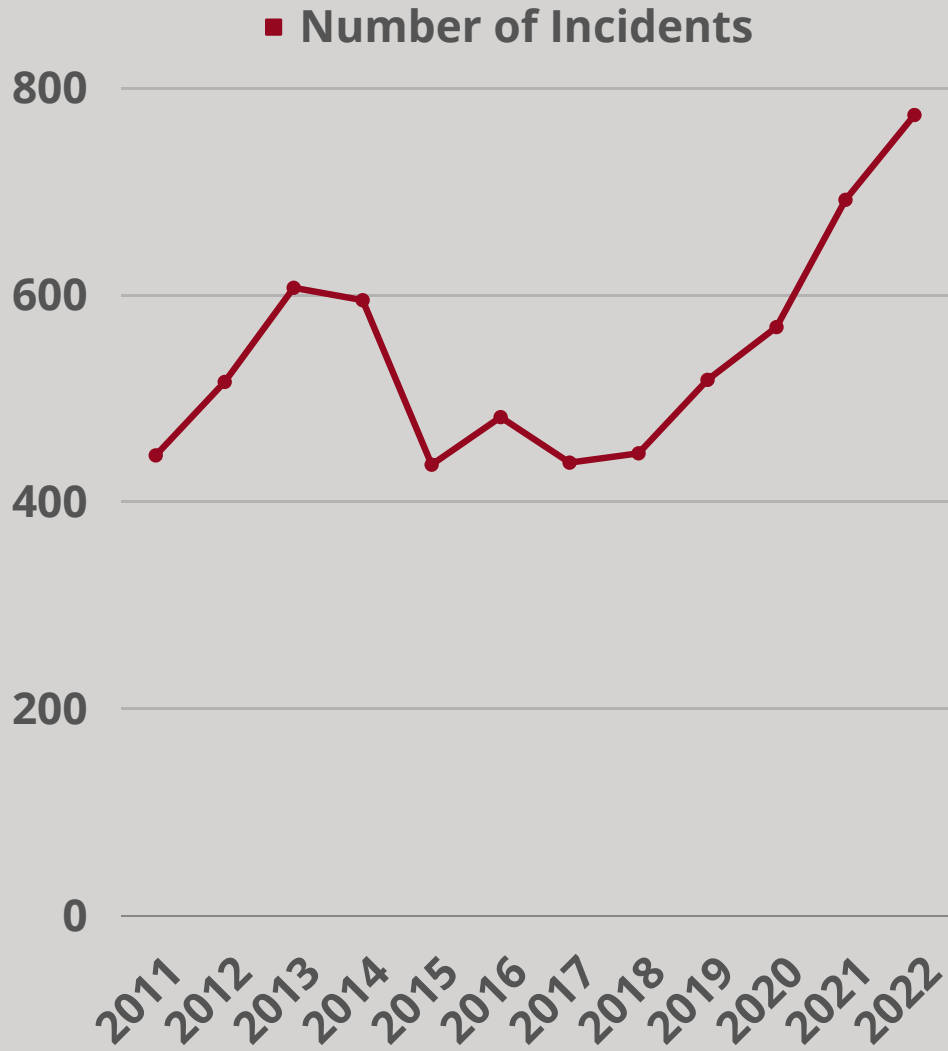

In 2022, the department logged 2323 hours of training by department members.

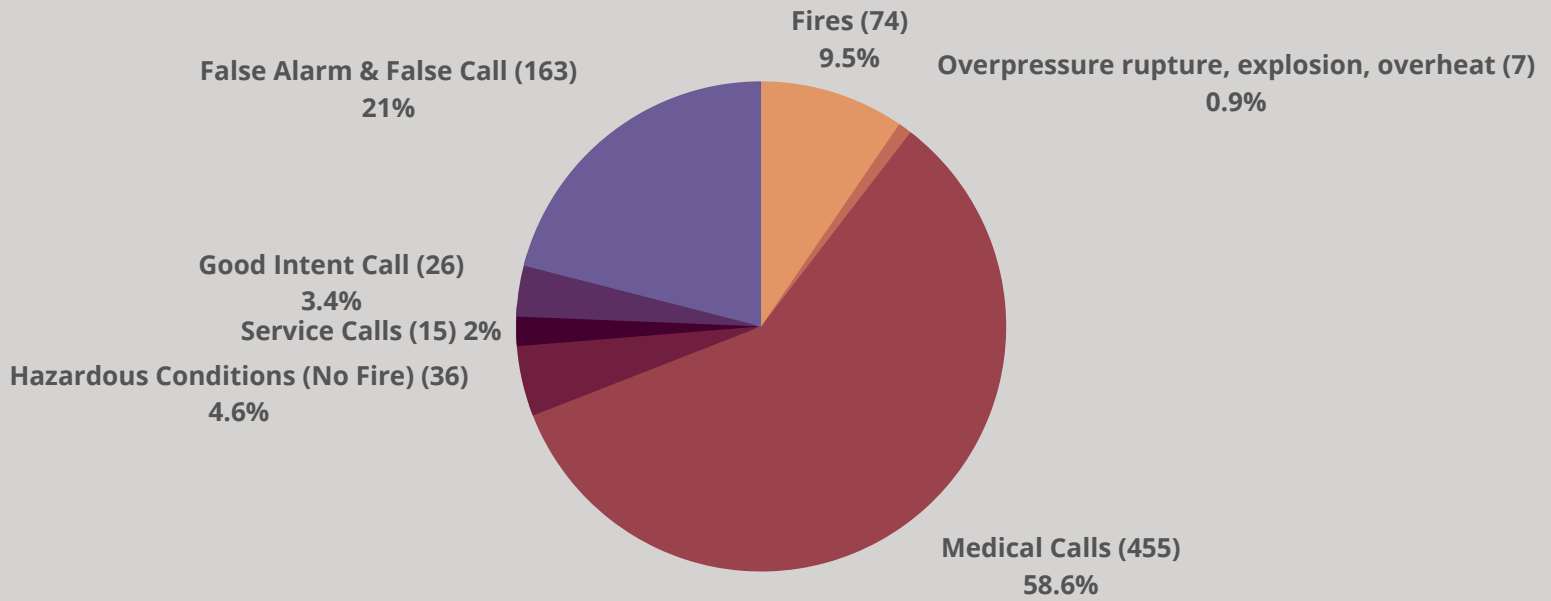

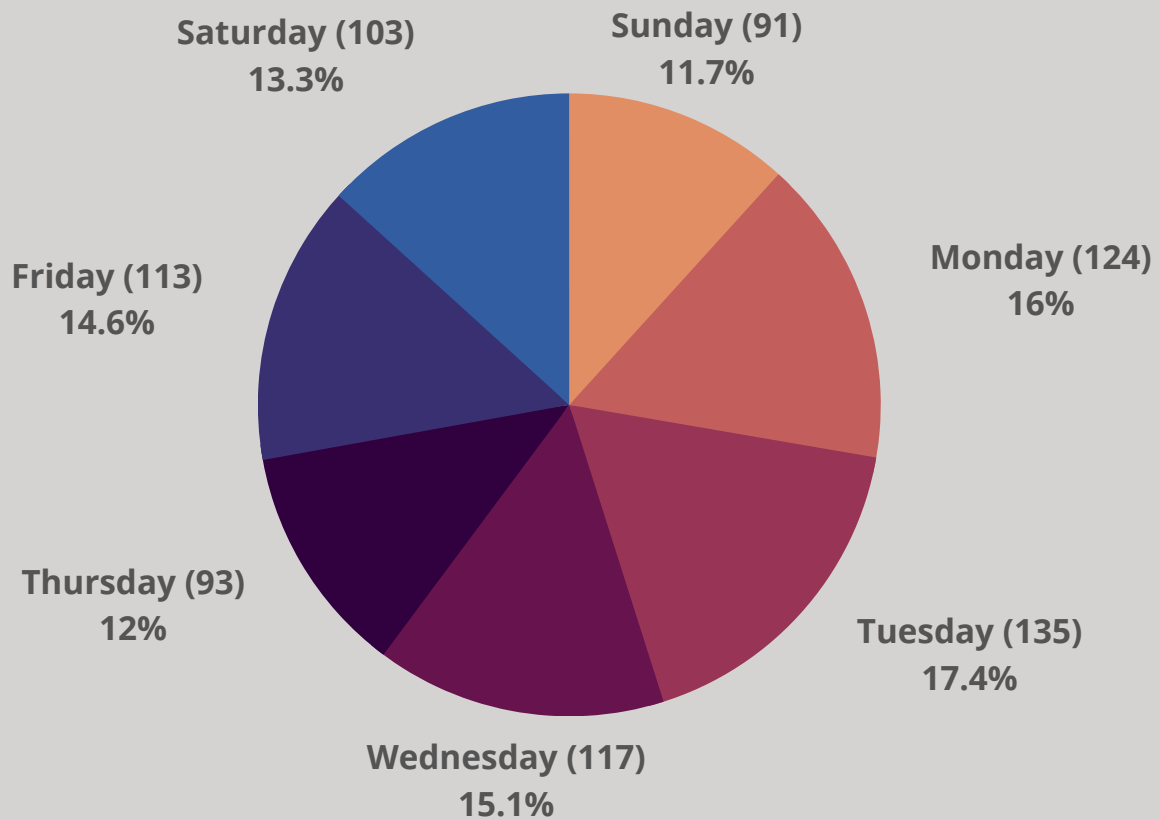


2022 Total Response Statistics

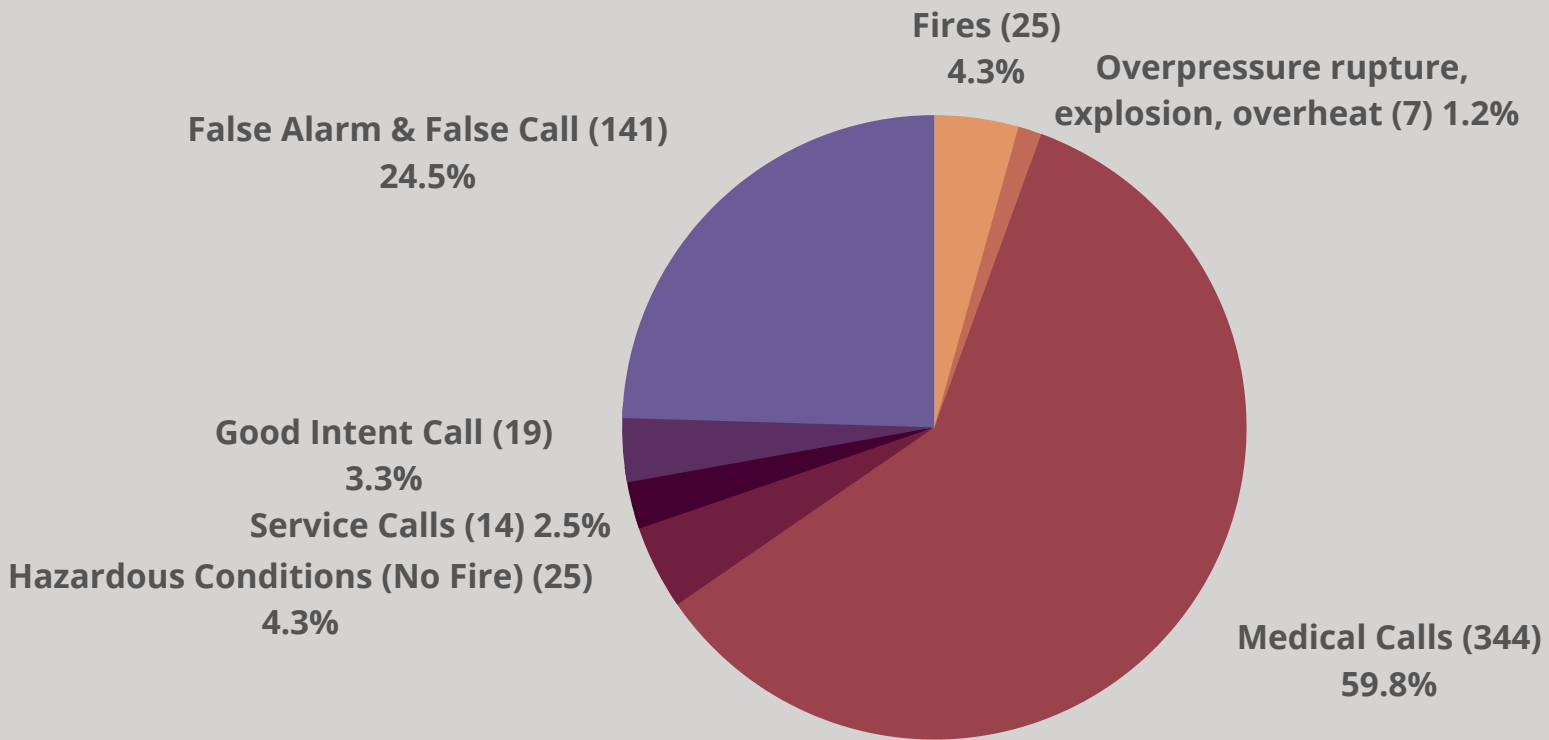
2022 Incidents By Time of Day

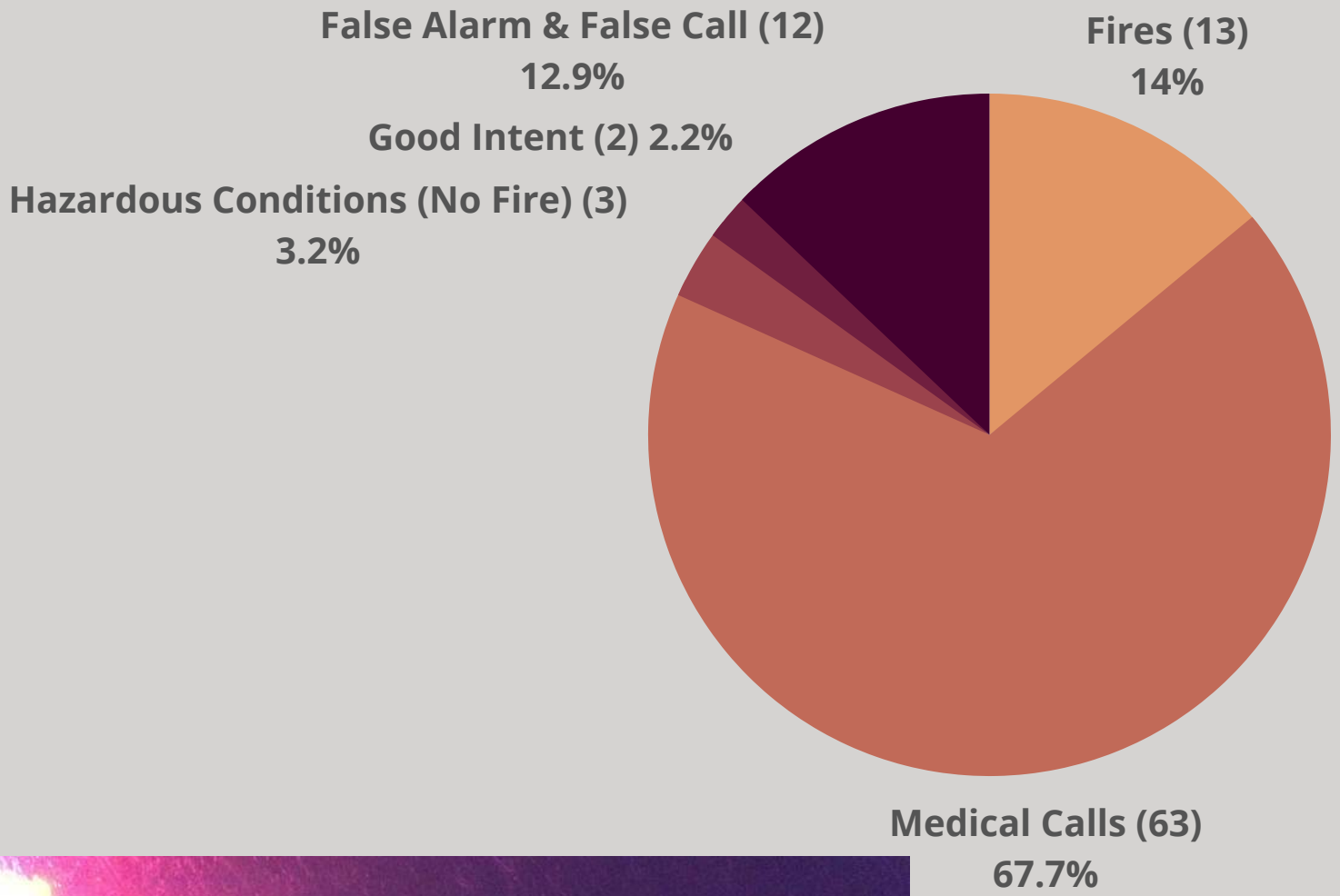

2022 Response Statistics- Rogers Only



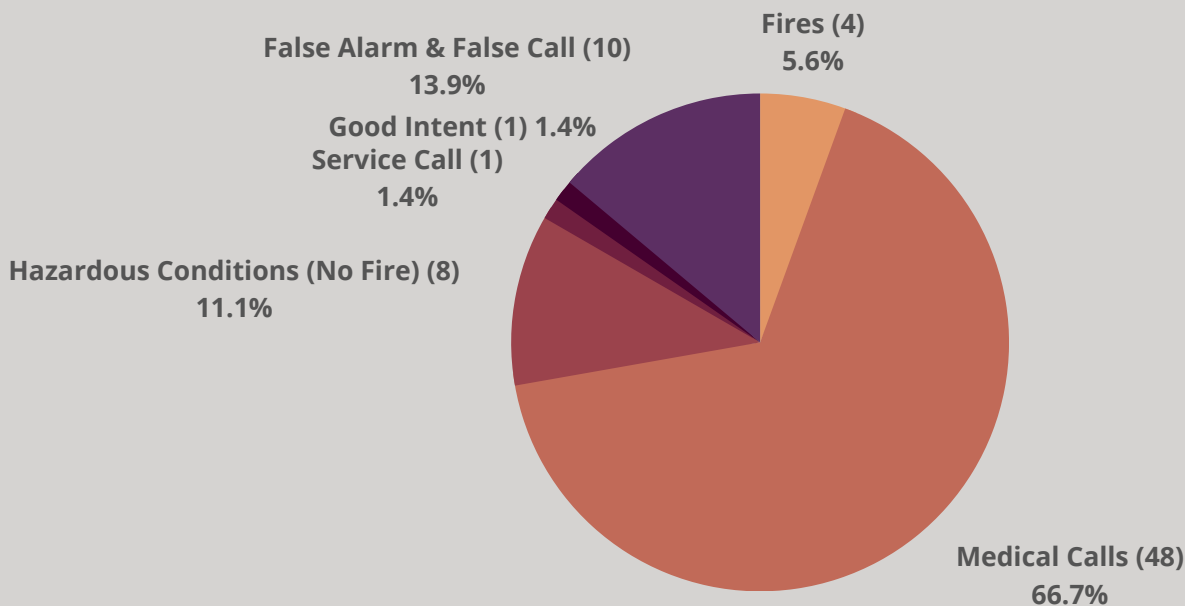
Total Incidents 575

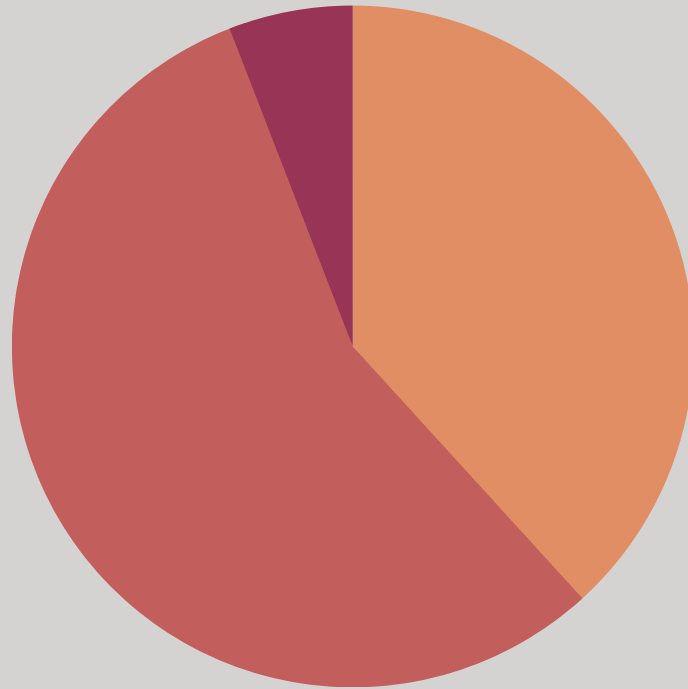
