

## Join the Force Behind the Badge: Rogers 3rd Citizens' Police Academy

The Rogers Police Department is preparing to host its 3rd Session of the Citizens' Police Academy (CPA), starting in September 2024. The CPA runs for 10 weeks from mid-September to mid-November, meeting every Wednesday at 6:30 pm at the Rogers Police Department. The CPA aims to help community members understand the Rogers Police Department's training, procedures, and philosophies. The CPA is a mix of classroom and hands-on training, instructed by police officers and staff. Most importantly, the CPA helps strengthen the relationship between the police department and the community, which in turn creates a stronger partnership in keeping our community safe.

Participants in the CPA can expect to hear from the Chief of Police, Police Captains, Detectives, and other guest speakers. Participants will also tour law enforcement facilities, view demonstrations, earn CPR/AED certification, and experience other hands-on learning.

The CPA is available to residents and those employed in the City of Rogers, and who are at least 18 years old. A criminal background check is required.





## Clean Up Day 2024

On Saturday, May 18, 2024, the Rogers Public Works Department will hold a Clean Up Day at the Rogers Public Works Building, 22350 South Diamond Lake Road (West of Kohl's), from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. This service is available for Rogers residents only. Contractors must find alternative services.

Attendees are asked to stay in their vehicles unless they need to get out to open a hatch/trailer, etc.

For the fastest and easiest service, please load and arrange items in the following order, beginning at the front of your trailer by the tongue/hitch or nearest the cab of your truck: (1st) scrap metal/tires/bikes; (2nd) oil/antifreeze; (3rd) recycling; (4th) batteries (no household alkaline or lithium batteries accepted); (5th) furniture; (6th) appliances; (7th) mixed solid waste/demo debris; (8th) electronics/light bulbs.

(Electronics/light bulbs will be unloaded first and scrap metal/tires/bikes will be unloaded last.)

There will be no refunds if someone other than City Staff removes items from the curb prior to pick up. Cash and credit cards accepted. Items such as cardboard, newspapers, plastic and glass bottles and phone books may be placed in your weekly curbside recycling container.

## Rogers Reserve Officer Program

The Rogers Police Department is currently seeking Reserve Officers. If you're interested in law enforcement and want to give back to your community, consider joining our reserve program. You can easily apply online through the City of Rogers website by clicking on the 'Jobs' tab, then 'Reserve Police Officer', and finally 'Apply Now' — it's that simple!

The Rogers Police Reserves serve as an integral part of the Police Department. Police Reserves are non-sworn volunteers who assist with city patrols and community events. They may also be called upon during natural disasters and other emergencies. Reserve Officers wear uniforms similar to those of Police Officers but are distinguished by slight differences and carry a duty belt with many of the same tools, except for a firearm. Our Reserve Officers are dedicated individuals seeking to contribute to their community, coming from a wide array of professional backgrounds.

## Eligibility Requirements :

- 18 years of age or older
- High School Diploma or equivalent
- Valid driver's license
- Must live within 30 minutes of the city
- Volunteer a minimum of 8 hours per month
- Attend monthly training meeting
- Meet all state mandated requirements including criminal background check
- Successful completion of an occupational health screen and psychological assessment

- Use of force
- Taser, mace, baton
- **Record management**
- Radio operation
- Subject searches
- Officer safety
- Other reserve duties

From all available records, the Rogers Fire Department was formed in 1931. As the department nears its 100th year of operation and is set to open its second station in the second half of 2024, we are looking for all available artifacts, photos, correspondence, and more related to the Rogers Fire Department's history. We want to gain a better understanding of our past as we progress into the future.

The Rogers Fire Auxiliary currently owns one of the city's original fire trucks, purchased in 1950 for \$8,500, and has restored it to operational condition. We have found the charter document that established the Rogers Fire Department Relief Association but have found nothing that details when the fire department was formally established.

We would love to see what artifacts exist in the community, what stories people may have, or what photos may exist.
