# **Parking Utilization Recap**

- Approximately 1,434 parking spaces in Downtown
  - 790 private stalls
  - 363 City owned stalls
  - 281 On-street stalls
- 251 stalls within 1 block of Main St/Church St
- 558 stalls within 2 blocks of Main St/Church St
  - Does not include Mary Queen of Peace Church
- Nearly 500 stalls located within Church parking lots.




# **Parking Utilization Recap**

- Within 1-2 blocks of Main St/Church St parking utilization was between 13% and 25%.
  - Lowest demand occurs of Sunday at 10:00 a.m.
  - Highest demand occurs on Friday at 12:00 p.m.
  - On-street parking was approximately 30% occupied on Friday at 12:00 p.m.
- Within the entire area reviewed utilization was between 8% to 23%.
  - Lowest demand occurs on Saturday at 1:00 p.m.
  - Highest demand occurred on Sunday at 10:00 a.m.
  - Majority of parking occurred in Church parking lots.



- No clear signing




# How many blocks are you willing to walk?

#### Q45 Have you avoided downtown because of a lack of vehicle pa





#### Recap

- There is currently not a shortage of public parking in Downtown (about 25% occupied at peak time).
- Public Parking was identified as important today and critically important tomorrow.
- As the area redevelops, there is a potential that a parking shortage will develop.
- The majority of people are willing walk up to 2 blocks to/from public parking to reach their destinations
- The types of businesses desired by residents are experience destinations and smaller shops/restaurants.
- Majority of people are not avoiding Downtown due lack of available parking but could as Downtown transforms.
- People are looking to Downtown to create an experience atmosphere.



#### **Next Steps**

- It is critical that future parking is adequately addressed to ensure the viability of Downtown.
- This study will focus on how to best plan for the future of Downtown and what is needed from a parking perspective to meet those needs.
- Future uses will be reviewed in the Small Area
   Plan to determine future demand and locations of potential public parking.
